ACTIVITY TITLE: GUESS THE QUESTION

AIM OF THE ACTIVITY: Review grammar and practice with idioms. Enhance creativity.

ESTIMATED DURATION: 20 minutes

MATERIALS NEEDED: Sheets with answers for every group.

ATTACHED DOCUMENTS: Example with idioms for primary.

SUGGESTED LEVEL: Easily adaptable to every level.

PROCEDURE

Dividing the class in pairs or groups of three is the best way to do this activity.

- 1.- Give each pair a sheet with the answers.
- 2.- Give them enough time depending on how many answers you have prepared in the sheet.
- 3.- Ask the students to think a possible question for each answer and write them down.
- 4.- Tell them to exchange their solutions with another pair and make suggestions in order to improve the questions.
- 5.- Return the solutions and check them all together. It is important to get as many possible questions as students can, asking them to be creative and guessing when they do not know the meaning of something.



Guess the question!

Try to write a possible question for each answer. You should read between the lines!

1) A:

B: No, it cost an arm and a leg!

2) A:

B: No, it doesn't look new. It has seen better days.

3) A:

B: Yes, I'm completely wet. It's raining cats and dogs out there!

4) A:

B: I would love it! Count me in!

5) A:

B: Perfect! It was a piece of cake!

6) A:

B: Ok, I will give it a shot.

7) A:

B: I won't trust him anymore. He let the cat out of the bag.

8) A:

B: I don't know but, cross your fingers!

9) A:

B: Yes, and I score the last goal. That was the icing on the cake!

10) A:

B: Yes, of course. I'm all ears.

Idioms meaning:

Read between the lines - Find the hidden meaning

It cost an arm and a leg – It was expensive

It has seen better days – For something old or in bad conditions

It's raining cats and dogs out there – It's raining heavily outside

Count me in – Count with me in your plans

It was a piece of cake – It was very easy

Let the cat out of the bag – Tell a secret

Give it a shot – Try it

Cross your fingers – For luck

The icing on the cake - Something additional that turns good into great
